WinterWorks: Playwright's Spotlight



Alec Silberblatt Ryan's Pub, Trivia Night



Q: You say that you "make heroes out of flawed folks". How do you approach that type of character development in your writing? A: Mainly I just draw them realistically, and show them for who they are, warts and all. Marci [from Ryan's Pub, Trivia Night] is an alcoholic, she knows it and talks about it. I am sick of seeing movie stars on stage, I want to see the people I see on the subway or the bus. I want to see the balding man who should consider doing something about his combover on stage. Those are the people I write about.

Outside of the theatre, I have only ever had hourly jobs, and those are the people I write about. I write about the people that get talked down to at work. I give my characters something to be good at. Allow them to build a dignified life.

Q: How do you see the role of theater in today's society, and what impact do you hope your plays have on audiences? A: Theatre has to be an event. It has to be worth coming to, so it has to be entertaining. Theatre should be fun, and exciting, it should be worth talking about.

Q: What can our audience look forward to seeing at Ryan's Pub, Trivia Night play reading? A: They can look forward to cheering on their new favorite trivia team.

Alec Silberblatt found theater when he was growing up in Pittsburgh, PA. His play *Ryan's Pub, Trivia Night* was selected from over 600 plays to be workshopped at the 2023 Seven Devils Playwrights Conference, and highlighted by World Premiere Wisconsin. Board Member Spotlight: Sean Linnan, Esq.

In the world of TAP, Sean stands out as a key player, wearing the hats of both board member and legal advisor. From founding and selling a law firm to sailing around the U.S. and Caribbean with his wife and children, he brings a unique perspective to the Door County community.

Beyond his role at TAP, Sean is a past president of the Rotary Club of Sturgeon Bay and serves on several other boards. Sean brings legal insight to nonprofit boards, aiming to make their missions more manageable.

How does the local theatre benefit the community? Sean: As a society, public events are becoming more and more important because people are secluding themselves away from their neighbors more and more through electronic media, computers, and their phones. We need to maintain these "old fashioned" arts to remind people what it's like to be a community in the "real world".

How do you engage with the community to ensure the theatre's success? Sean: Generally, my focus is on the operational side more than the "fill the seats" side. But I also realize that I'm a member of Generation X and a large group of the local theater participants are from an older generation than mine. The people I work with and see socially are a bit younger than the average theater-goer. So I make sure to promote the idea of theater when I can. I like to encourage families my age with high school children to attend to keep that spark of interest alive in the youngest generations. I also like to invite non-theater folks to come to a show with me and we promote it through short-term rentals.

How can someone get involved or support TAP? The most important role right now is to grab a half dozen friends and simply come to the shows! We want to keep the theater full and word of mouth strong. And for those who are interested in meeting community leaders and want to see how the sausage is made, we'll always welcome ushers before shows, help at the concession stand, and participation in committees such as
